

What Would Happen If The Medical Doctors Went On Strike?

What a frightening thought it is to think what would happen if the medical doctors decided to strike! People would be suffering and dying needlessly... or would they?

Current literature indicates that nearly 200,000 Americans die per year due to medical related causes. The Journal of the American Medical Association reported that adverse reactions to drugs in hospitals kill 100,000 Americans each year and seriously injure another 2,216,000. A Harvard study revealed that 155,000 Americans die per year as a result of medical accidents. The National Pharmaceutical Council stated that 125,000 deaths occur in the United States because of improper administration of prescription drugs. The American Medical News reported that 198,000 patients in the United States die each year due to medical mishaps. If the many current articles are correct, many people might be better off without medical care.

- In 1976, the medical doctors of Bogota, Columbia, went on strike for 52 days. The death rate dropped 35%.
- In 1976, the medical doctors of Los Angeles, California, went on strike because of their high malpractice premiums. They saw only those patients who were seriously ill or needed critical surgery. There was an 18% decrease in the death rate during that period of time. When the doctors returned to full time the death rate returned to the higher level.
- In 1973, doctors in Israel reduced patient contact by 90% for one month. The Israeli death rate dropped by a staggering 50% during that month.
- In March of 2000, the medical doctors from Israel Medical Association went on strike to protest a new contract. The death rate dropped by 39% as compared to the prior year.
